What is a 90-day supply prescription?

A prescription for a 90-day supply gives you enough medication to last three months all in one prescription fill.

Are there benefits to getting a 90-day supply prescription?

Yes. Switching to a 90-day supply prescription means you can order and pick up your medication less frequently.

How will a 90-day supply affect my cost? I am not sure I can afford it.

Since you will receive three months of medication at once, you will need to pay the three monthly copayments upfront. Overall, the total cost of your prescription is the same (unless you receive extra help from Medicare, in which case your costs for a 90-day supply are the same as your costs for a 30-day supply). If you currently pay \$0 for a 30-day supply of a medication on tier 1 of our drug list, your cost for a 90-day supply will also be \$0. Please note, members of most plans will pay lower costs for filling a 90-day supply prescription at a network preferred pharmacy than at a network standard pharmacy.

For information on extra help, call Medicare at 1-800-MEDICARE (1-800-633-4227), 24 hours a day, seven days a week. TTY users may call 1-877-486-2048.

If you prefer, you may ask the pharmacy to split your 90-day supply prescription into three separate 30-day supply prescriptions. You would then pay your 30-day supply cost when you fill your prescription each month over three months.

How do I get a 90-day supply prescription?

Your prescribing doctor must write the prescription for a 90-day supply.

Do all medications qualify for a 90-day supply prescription?

No. The only medications that qualify are those for chronic conditions such as high blood pressure, diabetes and cholesterol.

Where can I fill my 90-day supply prescription?

You can fill your prescription at any network retail or chain pharmacy. These are listed in the *Provider Directory*. You can also find a pharmacy using our online searchable directory at www.peopleshealth.com/pharmacies. Another option is to fill your prescription through the Peoples Health mail-order pharmacy, CVS Caremark, and have the prescription sent straight to your home every three months. CVS Caremark will call you before sending each prescription.



My prescription is for a 90-day supply, but the pharmacy keeps giving me a 30-day supply?

If you used the automated system to refill your prescription, speak to a pharmacist when ordering your next refill. Ask the pharmacist to manually change the days supply for the prescription to 90 days.

I still have pills left on a prescription, but it's not enough for a full 90-day supply?

If this happens, you can have your pharmacy request a new 90-day prescription from your physician.

The pharmacy gives me the wrong day supply?

Before you check out, ask the pharmacist if your prescription is eligible for the supply you want. Only certain prescriptions can be filled as a 90-day supply. If your prescription is eligible, then ask the pharmacist to reprocess the prescription.
